#### What is NCAS?

- A streamlined approach to assist Internationally Educated Practitioners (IEPs) to integrate into B.C.'s health workplace.
- Enhances the Province's capacity to build and maintain a safe, competent and adequately resourced nursing workforce.
- Assists BC's nursing community regulators/the Registry in making registration decisions in the public interest.



## **NCAS Pathway**






Computer-Based Assessment (CBA) – includes multiple choice and multiple select questions.

Simulation Lab Assessment (SLA) - includes a practice-based and interview on IEN thought processes and clinical judgment throughout the nursing scenarios.

## **NCAS** Innovations

- Nursing community --- Nursing Regulators and the Registry
- Collaboration & Shared Approach
  - → Identification of the key competencies in each of the nursing roles.
  - → Mapping of these competencies to a common organizing framework.
- Dual Rubric Assessment allows participants to be assessed in more than one nursing community role.
- Standardized competency assessment process for HCAs, LPNs and RPNs.



# Looking Forward – From Pilot to Operations

- In the pilot phase, 98 candidates participated in the pilot of the Computer Based Assessment, and 85 went on to complete the Simulated Lab Assessment pilot (July 2015 – March 2016).
- With funding from the Ministry of Health, the NCAS project is preparing to transition to operations starting April 2016.
  - Selection of Computer Based Assessment (CBA) Vendor
  - Identification of an Simulation Lab Assessment (SLA) Partner
  - Hiring of NCAS Director



#### Transitional Educational for IENs

- Enabling IEPs to target specific competency gaps through modularized skills upgrading.
- Ministry of Health funding has been directed towards the development of a Strategic Framework to Educational Bridging for Internationally Educated Nurses.
- Seeking innovation and collaboration in the development of transition education pathways for IENs.



# Advancing through NCAS

- ✓ Improved tools to determine IEN competency and to assure their provision of safe and effective nursing care.
- ✓ A streamlined approach to IEN integration into BC's health workplace:
  - Identification of specific competence gaps to assist in determining appropriate supplementary education
  - Identification of alternate profession/role for which the applicant has demonstrated the competencies
- Ongoing collaboration amongst the Nursing Community Partners, Post-Secondary Educators and Health Employers.
